

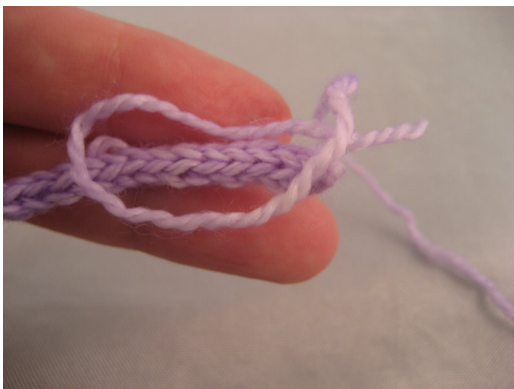
Leftover Laces



Materials: 2 size 1 DPNs, leftover sock yarn, tapestry needle

Gauge: not important

Method: Cast on 4 stitches, leaving a 12-inch tail, and continue to knit these four stitches by sliding across the needle at the end of each row and continuing to knit without turning. The yarn across the back will be drawn in as you continue knitting. Knit lace to desired length and then bind off, leaving a 12-inch tail.



Thread tail through a tapestry needle and run it through the center of the i-cord emerging about two inches from the base. Trim tail and use the trimmed piece for your whip knot. Lay the tail along the i-cord forming a loop as shown.



Begin to wrap the yarn around the i-cord tightly, leaving a bit of yarn sticking out at the bottom.



Wrap about $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch of the i-cord end and then thread the tail through the loop as shown.



Pull the tail at the bottom, drawing the loop tight until it pulls down beneath the top wraps. Trim ends and repeat with the other i-cord end.

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
